## ISSUING A PRESS RELEASE

Coastal Community Foundation is always supportive of any grantee issuing a press release about an award received from CCF and/or its affiliates. While it is not a requirement, we do prefer that grantees send us draft releases before they are issued and let us know when they anticipate releasing them.

## LOGO USAGE

EPS, JPG, and PNG files in full color and white are available for download on the News, Impact & Media Resources page at [coastalcommunityfoundation.org](http://coastalcommunityfoundation.org). All uses of CCF's logo must be approved by the Foundation's Marketing & Communications department. Please direct requests and questions to [communications@coastalcommunityfoundation.org](mailto:communications@coastalcommunityfoundation.org).

- Please do not modify the CCF logo in any way. This includes cropping, changing the color, changing the scale, or separating any elements from the logo lockup. Please do not add drop shadows or other effects.
- Always use the JPEG or EPS version of CCF’s main logo on materials you plan to print. PNG logo files should only ever be used on digital-only materials.
- The full color logo is best presented on a very light or very dark background. When the background is medium-light to medium-dark, the white logo should be used to ensure sufficient contrast.
- The smallest permissible height for the logo is 0.75”
- Always ensure the logo is surrounded by sufficient white or clear space.

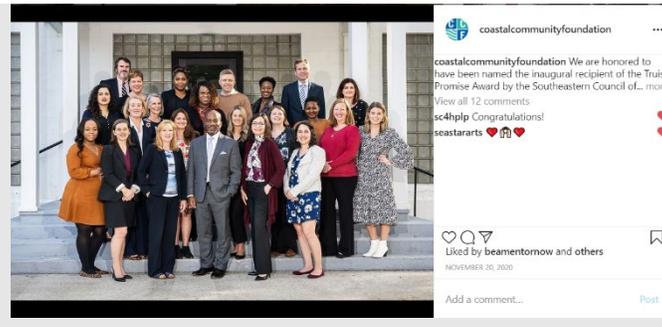
## PHOTOGRAPHY EXAMPLES
