

John and Susan Bennett Memorial Arts Fund Impact Report



he John and Susan Bennett Memorial Arts Fund provides annual grants to nonprofit organizations that support, promote, and advance the arts across South Carolina. Established in 2000 by the estate of John Bennett, a prominent Charleston attorney and passionate poetry enthusiast, the Fund honors the legacy of John's grandparents—intellectual leaders and avid supporters of the arts during Charleston's literary renaissance.

Since its inception, the Fund has awarded more than \$1.5 million to arts-focused nonprofits throughout South Carolina, made possible through the generosity of 28 donors who have contributed nearly \$1 million to sustain and grow its impact.

A Legacy of Service, Philanthropy, and Commitment to the Arts



John Bennett, a Charleston native, attended the Gaud School before earning his bachelor's degree from George Washington University and his law degree from the University of South Carolina. He went on to establish a distinguished career as a Charleston attorney and served as president of the Poetry Society of South Carolina.

John's commitment to public service was widely recognized. He received the Thomas A. Corn

Award from the Neighborhood Legal Assistance Program in 1984 and the Charleston County Bar Association's Gedney M. Howe Award for Public Service in both 1986 and 1987. Beyond his legal work, he served on the Board of Directors for the Christian Family Y and as Executive Director of the Clariosophic Foundation.

"John was one of the most benevolent men I have ever known," said his cousin, Becky Davis. "When he became sick and I began to read the letters that came for him, I realized how good he had been to others."

Today, John's philanthropic spirit lives on through the countless lives he touched and continues to impact through the legacy of this fund.


